

Program Details: The DAAD Distinguished Visiting Chair Program at Emory University

The DAAD Distinguished Visiting Chair Program at Emory University is for innovative, dynamic professors / scholars in any field or discipline who will teach, conduct research, and engage with Emory's academic community. The expectation is that the scholar's contributions will facilitate long-lasting academic exchanges between Emory University and Germany. Eligible candidates must have experience as a teacher / scholar, be a mid-career scholar, and hold a faculty appointment at a German university.

Funded by Emory's Halle Institute for Global Research and the DAAD, visiting chairholders spend one academic semester (up to four months) teaching, conducting research, and participating in activities that promote Emory's long-standing academic relationship with Germany. Visiting chairholders are hosted by appropriate departments and programs and engage with faculty and students.

Applications will be evaluated by the DAAD-Selection Committee and then, afterwards, by the Halle Institute for Global Research multi-disciplinary, multi-school faculty selection committee. Strong applications will be jargon-free and specifically demonstrate how a semester at Emory University will support their research and teaching. Candidates should discuss how they will share their teaching and research with faculty and students at Emory University and their home institution. The research plan should address how the applicant will take advantage of resources at Emory and its location in Atlanta.

The DAAD Distinguished Visiting Chair Program at Emory University strengthens cooperation between German institutions and Emory University across a wide range of disciplines. The research produced through this cooperation will be incorporated into the teaching programs of Emory and the visiting professor's home institution.

Terms:

Emory University will provide the Distinguished Visiting Chair a monetary honorarium of net \$2,200 per month for each month at Emory, after applicable US taxes are withheld, to be paid as a one-time payment of net \$8,800.

The Distinguished Visiting Chair will be asked to bring their own laptop and Emory will provide an office space with access to support facilities (copiers, fax, etc.), and assistance with housing.

DAAD provides the guest lecturer with a stipend for housing, living expenses, transportation, and the shipment of teaching materials and personal luggage. The funding consists of a daily stipend, for the duration of the lectureship; and transportation support, which includes a round trip, economy class, transatlantic flight including 20 kg of accompanied luggage; if necessary, the DAAD can also reimburse the shipping of up to 50 kg for unaccompanied luggage and scientific equipment. The sum paid by the DAAD will be determined according to the DAAD Funding Scheme for [Kurz- und Langzeitdozenten - DAAD](#) and is subject to change.

Health Insurance: Hospital and other medical expenses are the sole responsibility of each Distinguished Chair. Each Distinguished Chair must purchase health insurance coverage (accident and sickness insurance) sufficient to meet minimum requirements of Emory University. Emory adheres to all current health and safety standards in accordance with current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines of the United States of America. The Distinguished Visiting Chair shall provide evidence of receiving all Emory University vaccination requirements, prior to coming to Emory University.
